- rate landscape
 - CRF / structured SVM optimization

$$\mathbb{E}[\|x_{t+1} - \tilde{x}\|^2] \leq (1 - \mu \delta_t) \mathbb{E}[\|x_t - \tilde{x}\|^2] - 2\delta_t [\mathbb{E}f(x_t) - f(\tilde{x})] + \delta_t^2 B^2$$

True even if $\mu=0$; for δ_t small enough, we have $\mathbb{E}\|x_t - \tilde{x}\|^2$ decreases with t for any $\tilde{x} \in C$ st. $f(\tilde{x}) \leq \mathbb{E}f(x_t)$

$r(t)$
we have $r(t+1) \leq r(t)$

* non-strongly convex setting ($\mu=0$)

set \tilde{x} to be some minimizer x^* of f i.e. $f(x^*) = \min_{x \in C} f(x)$
in ineq. above

let $r_t \triangleq \mathbb{E}\|x_t - x^*\|^2$

[for better rate, let $\tilde{x} = x^* = \arg\min_{x \in C} \|x - x_0\|^2$]

let $\mathcal{E}_t \triangleq \mathbb{E}[f(x_t) - f(x^*)]$ expected suboptimality error

$$r_{t+1} \leq r_t - 2\delta_t \mathcal{E}_t + \delta_t^2 B^2 \quad \forall t$$

$$\Rightarrow 2\delta_t \mathcal{E}_t \leq r_t - r_{t+1} + \delta_t^2 B^2 \quad \forall t$$

$$\Rightarrow 2 \sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t \mathcal{E}_t \leq \underbrace{r_0 - r_{T+1}}_{\text{telescoping sum } \sum_{t=0}^T (r_t - r_{t+1})} + \left(\sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t^2 \right) B^2$$

$$2 \left(\sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t \right) \min_{0 \leq t \leq T} \mathcal{E}_t \leq 2 \sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t \mathcal{E}_t \leq \dots$$

a) $\Rightarrow \min_{0 \leq t \leq T} \mathcal{E}_t \leq r_0 + \frac{\left(\sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t^2 \right) B^2}{2 \sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t}$

note: $\min \mathcal{E}_t \rightarrow 0$

when $\frac{\sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t^2}{\sum_{t=0}^T \delta_t} \xrightarrow{T \rightarrow \infty} 0$

use $\delta_t = \frac{r_0}{B\sqrt{T+1}}$ to minimize RHS

$$\Rightarrow \min_{0 \leq t \leq T} \mathcal{E}_t \leq \frac{B r_0}{\sqrt{T+1}}$$

b) for $\hat{x}_T = \sum_t \lambda_t x_t$

Jensen

since f is convex, $f(\bar{x}_T) = f(\sum_t p_t x_t) \leq \sum_t p_t f(x_t)$

⊛ can also show that with $\gamma_t = \frac{A}{\sqrt{t+1}}$, $\min_{0 \leq t \leq T} \epsilon_t \leq O\left(\frac{\log(T+1)}{\sqrt{T+1}}\right)$

and if set C is bounded, can show $O\left(\frac{\text{diam}(C)}{\sqrt{T+1}}\right)$ rate

strongly convex case ($\mu > 0$)

$$\Gamma_{t+1} \leq (1 - \mu \gamma_t) \Gamma_t - 2 \gamma_t \epsilon_t + \gamma_t^2 B^2$$

use $\gamma_t = \frac{2}{\mu(t+2)}$

divide

$$\epsilon_t \leq \frac{1}{2} (\gamma_t^{-1} - \mu) \Gamma_t - \frac{\gamma_t^{-1}}{2} \Gamma_{t+1} + \frac{\gamma_t B^2}{2}$$

$$\gamma_t^{-1} = \frac{\mu(t+2)}{2}$$

multiply ineq. by $(t+1)$

$$(t+1) \epsilon_t \leq \frac{1}{2} (t+1) \left(\frac{\mu(t+2) - 2\mu}{2} \right) \Gamma_t - \frac{\mu}{4} (t+1)(t+2) \Gamma_{t+1} + \frac{(t+1) \mu B^2}{2 \mu(t+2)}$$

$$\leq \frac{\mu}{4} \left[\underbrace{t(t+1) \Gamma_t}_{\triangleq U_t} - \underbrace{(t+1)(t+2) \Gamma_{t+1}}_{U_{t+1}} \right] + \frac{B^2}{\mu} \leq \frac{B^2}{\mu}$$

(sum ineq.)
⇒

telescoping sum

$$\sum_{t=0}^T (t+1) \epsilon_t \leq \frac{\mu}{4} [U_0 - U_{T+1}] + (T+1) \frac{B^2}{\mu}$$

let $\rho_t \triangleq \frac{(t+1)}{S_T}$

where $S_T \triangleq \sum_{t=0}^T (t+1) = \frac{(T+1)(T+2)}{2}$

$$S_T \sum_{t=0}^T \rho_t \epsilon_t \leq \frac{\mu}{4} [0 - (T+1)(T+2) \Gamma_{T+1}] + (T+1) \frac{B^2}{\mu}$$

$$\sum_{t=0}^T \rho_t \epsilon_t + \underbrace{\frac{\mu}{4} \frac{(T+1)(T+2)}{S_T} \Gamma_{T+1}}_{\frac{\mu}{2} \Gamma_{T+1}} \leq \underbrace{\frac{(T+1) B^2}{S_T \mu}}_{\frac{2}{T+2} \frac{B^2}{\mu}} \quad (\dagger)$$

let $\bar{x}_T \triangleq \sum_{t=0}^T \rho_t x_t$ (weighted average)

convexity
 $f(\bar{x}_T) \leq \sum p_t f(x_t)$

$\epsilon_t \dots$

$$f(\hat{x}_T) \leq \sum_t p_t f(x_t)$$

$$\Rightarrow \mathbb{E}[f(\hat{x}_T) - f(x^*)] \leq \sum_t p_t \mathbb{E}[f(x_t) - f(x^*)] \leq \frac{2B^2}{T+2}$$

thus $\mathbb{E}[f(\hat{x}_T) - f(x^*)] \leq \frac{2B^2}{T+2}$ vs. $O(\frac{1}{\sqrt{T}})$ rate when $\mu=0$

also $\mathbb{E}[\|x_{T+1} - x^*\|^2] \leq \frac{4B^2}{\mu^2(T+2)}$

Landscape of global convergence rates

f is convex rate on suboptimality $f(x) - f(x^*) \leq \dots$

stochastic setting: $\mathbb{E}[f(\hat{x}_t) - f(x^*)] \leq \dots$

$r_0 \geq \text{dist}(x_0, x^*)$

assumptions	rate (deterministic/batch)	stochastic setting	finite sum special case $\frac{1}{n} \sum_{i=1}^n f(x_i)$
1) non-smooth $\ \partial f \ \leq B$	$O(\frac{Br_0}{\sqrt{t}})$ subgradient method	$O(\frac{Br_0}{\sqrt{t}})$	
2) smooth L -Lipschitz ∇f	$O(\frac{Lr_0^2}{t})$ gradient method $O(\frac{Lr_0^2}{t^2})$ Nesterov method (optimal "lower bound")	$O(\frac{\sigma}{\sqrt{t}})$ SGD	$O(\frac{\ln L}{t})$ SAG/SAGA SVRG ↳ "depress version" [Hoffman & al.]
f is μ -strongly convex	3) non-smooth $\ \partial f \ \leq B$ $O(\frac{B^2}{\mu t})$ subgradient method 4) smooth L -Lipschitz $O(\exp(-\frac{\mu}{L} t))$ gradient method $O(\exp(-\frac{\mu}{\sqrt{L}} t))$ Nesterov "optimal"	$O(\frac{B^2}{\mu t})$ $O(\frac{\sigma}{\mu t})$	$O(\exp(-\min\{\frac{\mu}{L}, \frac{\mu^2}{L}\} t))$ SAG/SAGA SVRG

⊗ note: projecting gives the same rates

more generally, proximal gradient method as well

smooth non-smooth

Setup: "composite smooth opt." $\min_x f(x) + h(x)$

constrained opt.: $h(x) \triangleq \delta_C(x) \triangleq \begin{cases} +\infty & \text{if } x \notin C \\ 0 & \text{o.w.} \end{cases}$

proximal gradient method:

$$x_{t+1} \stackrel{\text{prox step}}{=} \underset{x}{\operatorname{argmin}} \underbrace{f(x_t) + \langle \nabla f(x_t), x - x_t \rangle + \frac{\gamma}{2} \|x - x_t\|^2}_{\text{prox step}} + h(x)$$

$$\frac{\gamma L}{2} \|x - (x_t - \frac{1}{\gamma L} \nabla f(x_t))\|^2 = \text{const.}$$

* if $h = \delta_C \Rightarrow$ projected gradient method

• but can also run on other "simple" h , e.g. $h(x) = \|x\|_1$ (Lasso type problem)

[accelerated prox gradient] = FISTA ; SOTA for deterministic ℓ_1 -reg. problems (small n)

Optimization of $\hat{J}(w)$

$$\hat{J}(w) = R(w) + \frac{1}{n} \sum_{i=1}^n J(x^{(i)}, y^{(i)}; w)$$

say $R(w) = \frac{\lambda \|w\|_0^2}{2}$

recall $h_w(x) = \underset{\tilde{y} \in \mathcal{Y}}{\operatorname{argmax}} \langle w, \phi(x, \tilde{y}) \rangle$

CRF:

$$\hat{J}_{\text{CRF}}(x, y; w) \stackrel{\Delta}{=} \log \left(\sum_{\tilde{y}} \exp(\langle w, \phi(x, \tilde{y}) \rangle) \right) - \langle w, \phi(x^{(i)}, y^{(i)}) \rangle$$

here $\hat{J}_{\text{CRF}}(w)$ is L -smooth & λ -strongly convex

conditional neg. log-likelihood loss $p(y|x) \propto \exp(s(y))$

weighted avg. SGD \rightarrow get a rate of $O(\frac{1}{\text{iter}})$

What do we need?
to run SGD

$$\text{compute } D_w \hat{J}(x, y; w) = \frac{1}{\sum_{\tilde{y}} \exp(s(\tilde{y}))} \left[\phi(x, \tilde{y}) - \phi(x, y) \right]$$

$$= \mathbb{E}_{\tilde{y}|x, w} [\phi(x, \tilde{y})] - \phi(x, y)$$

$$\text{CRF: } \phi(x, \tilde{y}) = \sum_{c \in \mathcal{C}} \phi_c(x, \tilde{y}_c)$$

, marginal over \tilde{y}_c .

$$CRF: \varphi(x, \tilde{y}) = \sum_{C \in \mathcal{C}} \varphi_c(x, \tilde{y}_c)$$

$$\text{then } \mathbb{E}_{\tilde{y}|x}[\varphi(x, \tilde{y})] = \sum_{C \in \mathcal{C}} \mathbb{E}_{\tilde{y}_c|x}[\varphi_c(x, \tilde{y}_c)]$$

marginal over \tilde{y}_c
 use sum-product alg on trees eg
 or junction tree alg for small tree with graph

structured SVM:

$$S_{\text{hinge}}(x^{(i)}, y^{(i)}; w) = \max_{\tilde{y} \in \mathcal{Y}} \langle w, \varphi(x^{(i)}, \tilde{y}) \rangle - \langle w, \varphi(x^{(i)}, y^{(i)}) \rangle$$

$$\text{let } l_i(\tilde{y}) \triangleq l(y^{(i)}, \tilde{y})$$

$$H_i(w) \triangleq S_{\text{hinge}}(x^{(i)}, y^{(i)}; w) \longrightarrow = \max_{\tilde{y} \in \mathcal{Y}} l_i(\tilde{y}) - \underbrace{\langle w, \varphi_i(\tilde{y}) \rangle}_{m(\tilde{y}) \text{ "margin element"}}$$

$$\varphi_i(\tilde{y}) \triangleq \varphi(x^{(i)}, \tilde{y}) - \varphi(x^{(i)}, y^{(i)})$$

$$H_i(w; \tilde{y}) \triangleq l_i(\tilde{y}) - \langle w, \varphi_i(\tilde{y}) \rangle$$

note: if $\langle w, \varphi_i(\tilde{y}) \rangle > 0 \quad \forall \tilde{y} \neq y^{(i)}$

then $h_w(x^{(i)}) = y^{(i)}$

structured SVM objective
(non-smooth unconstrained form)

$$\min_w \frac{\lambda \|w\|^2}{2} + \sum_{i=1}^n H_i(w)$$

⊛ this fits stochastic sub. method framework: $f(w) = \mathbb{E}_i h(w; i)$ where $h(w; i) \triangleq \frac{\lambda \|w\|^2}{2} + H_i(w)$

now a subgradient of $h(w; i)$

$$h'(w; i) = \lambda w - \varphi_i(\hat{y}_i(w))$$

$$\mathbb{E}_i h'(w; i) = \lambda w - \sum_{i=1}^n \varphi_i(\hat{y}_i(w)) = f'(w)$$

[but h subgradient]

$\hookrightarrow \triangleq \arg \max_{\tilde{y} \in \mathcal{Y}} l_i(\tilde{y}) - \langle w, \varphi_i(\tilde{y}) \rangle$
loss-augmented inference

convergence rate:

have f is λ -strongly convex

suppose that $\|\varphi_i(\tilde{y})\| \leq R \quad \forall i, \tilde{y} \in \mathcal{Y}$

then one can show that with $\gamma_t = \frac{2}{\lambda(t+2)}$
and $w_0 = 0$

example: $\varphi(x, \tilde{y}) = \sum_{C \in \mathcal{C}} \varphi_c(x, \tilde{y}_c)$
 $\|\varphi(x, y)\|_2 \leq \sum_{C \in \mathcal{C}} \|\varphi_c(x, y_c)\|_2$

, then $\mathbb{E} \|g_t\|^2 \leq 4R^2$ + gives our B^2

[exercise: adapt App. A of Arora note [Lacoste-Julien et al. 2012](#)]

$\rightarrow O\left(\frac{R^2}{\lambda t}\right)$ rate
